STUDENT TRAVEL GRANTS

Each year NZARE encourages student members to attend the annual conference by making travel grants available. The student travel grant covers the Early Student registration fee for the conference and offers a contribution towards travelling expenses at the lowest fare.

Here's how to qualify for the grant:

- be a paid up student member of NZARE enrolled at least half-time and in less than half-time employment;
- be the author or co-author of a paper or poster at the annual conference; and
- have your paper or poster accepted for presentation

BECOMING A STUDENT MEMBER

The cost of becoming a student member is \$56.25. This is payable by cheque to NZARE. Membership forms and further details are available on the NZARE website.

STUDENT REPRESENTATION

THE RAE MUNRO AWARD

The Rae Munro Award honours the outstanding contribution of Dr Raeside Munro to educational research and teaching practice. It is awarded annually for an excellent Masters-level thesis by a student member in an area that has implications for teacher education or classroom practice. Nominations are invited in the first issue of *INPUT* of each year.

THE SUTTON-SMITH DOCTORAL AWARD

The Sutton-Smith Doctoral Award honours Brian Sutton-Smith. Professor Sutton-Smith was awarded the first Education PhD in New Zealand in 1954. The Sutton-Smith Doctoral Award will be awarded annually for an excellent Doctoral thesis by an NZARE member. Theses nominated must have been undertaken in New Zealand and/or have clear implications for New Zealand education. Theses must have been completed and examined between 1 September and 31 August of the calendar year prior to the closing date for nominations, which is 1 September.
