LEARNING IN CRISES

NZARE 2021 call for abstracts

The conference organising committee invites you to participate in the 2021 NZARE Conference. We are seeking abstracts that relate to a wide range of topics including:

- Conference theme: Learning in crises – find more information on the theme [here](#)
- Any of the focus areas of a NZARE [Special Interest Group](#) (SIG) (see list below)
- Any other educational research topic.

Authors may submit an abstract for presentation in one of the following formats:

Individual paper presentation

All individual presentations will be allocated a 20-minute timeslot and grouped with two similar presentations where possible. When preparing your presentation allow for a 15-minute presentation and up to 5 minutes of questions and discussion.

Symposium presentation

A symposium presentation consists of three presentations and a discussant/chairperson, who may be one of the presenters. Each symposia are allocated 90 minutes. The title of the symposium plus the names and affiliations of all participants in the session, including the chair, and an overview of 400 words should be submitted by the organiser. In addition, each presenter in the symposium must submit an abstract of 400 words. Organisers of symposium proposals must nominate a discussant/chairperson and organise the session to allow time for questions and discussion.

Round table discussion

A round table discussion consists of three or four papers that focus on a theme or issue for discussion. Papers of approximately 2000 words from each author are available in advance and the expectation is that those attending the discussion will have read the papers and considered a question posed by the author. Each author will present a five-minute overview of their research and question before the facilitated discussion begins.

Submission guidelines

Abstracts will be reviewed on the following six elements:

1. Objectives or purpose
2. Contemporary significance and/or scholarly relevance
3. Conceptual and/or methodological soundness
4. Perspective(s) or theoretical framework
5. Results and /or substantiated conclusions.

6. Relevance to the conference.

Submission guidelines, terms, and conditions

All abstract submissions must comply with the following:

- All abstracts are to be submitted online via the Abstract Submission Portal on the [NZARE](#) website no later than 5pm 16 July 2021.

When submitting your abstract for individual paper, symposium or table discussion, you will be asked to include or indicate the following:

- Title of presentation
- Up to three keywords
- Author(s) and affiliation(s), including name(s) of presenter(s)
- Email address and phone number of corresponding presenter.
- Special Interest Group (SIG) of NZARE most closely related to the subject of the presentation if relevant.
- Abstract content (100 words or less)
- Preferred presentation formats (individual presentation, table discussion, or poster presentation) please list in order of preference

When submitting for symposium presentation, you will be asked to include or indicate the following:

- Title of symposium
- Symposium overview (100 words)
- Authors and affiliations, including names of presenters and discussant/chairperson
- Email addresses and phone numbers of presenters and discussant/chairperson.
- Abstract for each presentation within the symposium (100 words each).
- Special Interest Group (SIG) most closely related to the subject of the presentation if relevant

It is an expectation that presenters whose abstract has been accepted and who wish to present their research will register to attend the conference.

- Authors may offer no more than two abstract submissions in which they appear as the lead author.
- Conference attendees may not undertake the role of discussant for more than two symposia.
- The Conference Programme Committee reserves the right to accept or reject any submissions.
- The acceptance of an abstract does not imply provision of travel, accommodation or registration for the conference, nor any other costs associated with preparation or presentation of the abstract, or attendance at the conference.
- Submission implies that you give NZARE and the Conference Organisers permission to publish your abstract on the NZARE website and/or in hardcopy if it is accepted for presentation.

Abstract Submission Workshop – How to write a punchy 100-word abstract

This year we have reduced the word count for abstract submissions to 100 words. To help develop this skill, we are hosting a zoom workshop on how to write a punchy 100-word abstract. Bring an abstract (not longer than 150 words) and let's trim it down to 80 – 100 words for quality of message.
