

Getting there:

Parking:

Parking is available on site at the Hamilton campus. Use the free [PayMyPark app](#) to pay parking fees, or pay online at the [PayMyPark website](#). You can choose from a range of options including daily, weekly and trimester parking. Be sure to select The University of Waikato as the app defaults to Hamilton City Council. **Car parks for the public are: Gate 1, Gate 2b, and Gate 3a.**

Parking charges (\$2 for 24hrs) apply from 8:30am—4:30pm, Monday to Friday excluding public holidays. Parking is free outside of these hours. Motorbike parking is free at all times in designated motorbike parks.

Paid parking applies to all cars parked on campus. Do not park in a numbered/named park because these are reserved for permit holders at all times (clamping fees apply).

Public transport:

If you are travelling from the central city the best bus to catch is the [Meteor](#). It leaves from the Transport Centre and you can get off at either the University (Knighon Road) stop or keep going to the St Johns (Hillcrest Rd) option. It takes about 20 mins.

Drop off area:

If you are not intending to park, or are being dropped off, the best location would be Gate 8, Hillcrest Road. This is the closest parking area to The Pā, and other venues for NZARE. This is a reserved parking only area, but has plenty of space for drop offs.

Walk

For those wanting to get a walk in before the start of the day, it is approximately 1 hr between the city and university depending on the route you take. If you go via Hamilton East you could stop and find a good coffee along the way.
